## Music Notes

**Hosanna! The King Comes Today!** This Palm Sunday anthem text by Emily Lund was inspired by Psalms 24 and 118. Paired with children's voices, this piece echoes with the rousing cries of "Hosanna! The King Comes Today!" Emily Kroese Lund (b. 1971) began composing in 2000, focusing on sacred choral and children's music, as well as sacred piano arrangements. She is a member of the Escondido United Reformed Church in California, where she serves as a pianist and organist.

**Lift Up Your Heads, O Ye Gates** is a setting by Welsh composer William Mathias (1934-1992) of the familiar text from Psalm 24:7-10. Set in the Lydian mode, Mathias uses jazzy syncopations and repeating text with changing metrical accents in this joyful anthem of praise. A child prodigy, Mathias started playing the piano at the age of three and began composing at the age of five. His compositions include large scale works, including an opera, three symphonies and three piano concertos. Much of his music was written for the Anglican choral tradition, most famously the anthem Let the people praise Thee, O God written for the July 1981 royal wedding of the Prince and Princess of Wales. He founded the North Wales International Music Festival in St Asaph in 1972 and directed it until his death, aged 57, in 1992.

**A Lenten Love Song**, words and music by Helen Kemp (1918-2015), has become a staple of children's choral repertoire for Lent. Written in 1989, she set the Matthew 26: 36-39 text to a haunting melody using a descending scale pattern in 4/4 meter. The anthem concludes unexpectedly with a chorus in Latin in 6/8 meter in a major key. The late Helen Kemp was, alongside husband John Kemp, a founding member and leader of Choristers Guild. A lyric soprano, it was her love for the art of singing that propelled her into the field of children's choirs, which she regarded as the seed-bed for musical, artistic and personal growth of young choristers. Known internationally as a specialist in the area of training young voices, she served as guest conductor and clinician in both university and church settings. She guided and shaped successful children's choirs in churches, schools and communities in North American and beyond. Her books and prepared instructional materials have become standard resources. The Kemps served two tenures on the faculty of Westminster Choir College, Princeton, NJ, and held church positions in several states, including one at First Presbyterian Church, Oklahoma City, where they spent 20 years developing an acclaimed church music program. Well into her nineties she continued to work with children at music workshops and festivals. Her motto: Body, mind, spirit, voice! It takes the whole person to sing and rejoice!

**Go to Dark Gethsemane** is a setting by T. Tertius Noble of the hymn found at #290 in the UMC hymnal: words by James Montgomery (1820) and music by Richard Redhead (1853.) Dedicated to H. Alexander Matthews and the Choir of St. Luke and Epiphany in Philadelphia, the work was published in 1918. This a cappella anthem is numbered 116 in our library and was purchased for 22 cents a copy! Thomas Tertius Noble (1867-1953) studied at the Royal College of Music and served as organist and choirmaster of York Minster before coming to the United States in 1913 to become organist and choirmaster of St. Thomas Church in New York City, where he established a choir school in the English cathedral tradition, remaining there until his retirement in 1947. He composed a significant amount of choral, vocal, orchestral and organ music. T. Tertius Noble was an outstanding musician, organist and choirmaster. Known now primarily as a composer of sacred music-anthems, hymntunes, original organ works, and the two celebrated collections of free organ accompaniments to familiar hymns-he was also a composer of operas, orchestral works, chamber music, and songs.

**Christ, We Do All Adore Thee** (*Adoramus Te, Christe*) is the final chorus of Dubois' *Les sept paroles du Christ*. Théodore Dubois (1837 – 1924) was an important organist, composer and teacher of music on the Paris music scene during the late 1800's. The composer of four operas, a large-scale ballet, several oratorios, and a Requiem Mass as well as many orchestral works, Dubois remained a composer of the "academic style." He composed *The Seven Last Words of Christ* in 1867 for Saint Clotilde in Paris, where he was the choir director (*Maitre de chapelle*). At the end of the *Seventh Word*, Dubois concludes his sacred cantata with a serene hymn-like setting of the medieval antiphon *Adoramus Te, Christe*.


